As you will know from the Journal, The AGM takes place at the National Memorial Arboretum on 16th March.

Page 35 of the February edition includes a proxy voting form, which can be used as a postal voting form. There is a provision for you to appoint a proxy to vote on your behalf in the manner they think most appropriate.

Our Area Rep, Dan, asks us **NOT** to appoint him as proxy, as he has reservations about the system.

You can use this instead of posting the form from the journal. You **DON'T** have to appoint a proxy, (see the second line under "Entitlement to vote.")

if you choose to vote by proxy but do not name someone else to vote for you, this will make the Chairman of the meeting your proxy. On each section, if you have no preference, you can choose "Abstain" rather than "Proxy."

If you choose a proxy then they must vote as you have indicated. All this and other relevant information is in the February Journal and also in the Members Section of the website.

Sammy's Gems.

In September last year, I finally managed to visit the Sammy Miller Motorcycle Museum in New Milton, Hampshire. I thoroughly recommend a visit. In the meantime, there will be a short section (Trials reference there!) in each edition about some of my favourites.

1948 250 Redrup 3-Cylinder Radial.



Redrups were bulit by Charlers Redrup, an aircraft engineer. His first radial engine was a 304cc sidevalve, which it seems had the cylinders mounted vertically. This 248cc machine has an OHV engine with horizontal cylinders and a system of cams and oscillating cruciform to operate the valves.

The frame is pre-war Royal Enfield with an Albion gearbox.

Interesting Special.





This 'Scott Special' was built by talented Scott enthusiast, the late Bruce Simpson, between 2003 and 2005 and UK-registered early 2006. Based on an earlier Scott 350 frame with the super rare 500cc twin-carb Scott Swift engine with a Matchless gearbox, the forks, rear swing arm, wheels and brakes are from a Suzuki RGV250.

Described at the time by Bruce as 'a Scott for the 2000's, the bike came up for auction at The ExCeL on 16th February. Guide price was £6000-£8000 It came complete with an extensive history file documenting the build along with a magazine article where the bike has been featured. Also included were old MOTs, numerous receipts and awards. In running order although unused for a while, so may require some recommissioning before use. UK-registered on a current V5C.
